WHEN IN OUR MUSIC GOD IS GLORIFIED

Ann Simonson is incredibly brave. She has opened a door that many would never dare to even approach. She has offered those who worship here at Magnolia, the chance to suggest favorite hymns and songs for worship. I just saw one turned in last week, and it was filled from top to bottom. At that rate, she could end up with hundreds of suggestions, and the opportunity to use only a few of these gems in any particular week.

There have been times when I have had to choose the music, and it drove me nuts...or at least a few more miles down that road. So much good music, and so little time. I found it a frustrating task where the results seldom seem to measure up to what I might hope for. So I gladly let Ann do her thing. She does it well.

I did notice that there is no assurance and no implied guarantee. She is also wise. Not every song fits the needs, nor the service's work of telling the love of God. The Bible texts, the Prayer of the Day, even the time of the Church Year, all are intended to work together. So when we add in the music, it should also work to the same end. I suppose it means that my own choice, "Drop Kick Me Jesus through the Goalposts of Life" may end up way down the list and may finally be used on the Sixth Sunday in May in 2046.

As Lutherans, we come by a love for music honestly. Luther's last name may have actually been "Lutter" referring to one who made music stringed instruments, such as a Lute or Guitar. He changed it to

"Luther" in reference to the Greek word for "Freedom" which is "eh-loo-ther-i-os" mindful of the freedom that the Gospel brings. He was known to have a fine Tenor voice, and used music to teach scripture truths. 20 Hymns in the LBW list Luther as a source of the verses, notably all 14 verses of "From Heaven Above", LBW 51. Lutheran Schools and Universities, certainly in this country, place an emphasis on music as an important part of a well-rounded education. Many times they sponsor music programs known for their excellence.

I finagled my way into the festival choir for the national meeting of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians, meeting in Seattle this year. I got to sing under the direction of Dr. Anton Armstrong while John Ferguson sits at the Organ Bench for a Hymn Sing. To worship in such a setting is truly a foretaste of heavenly things to come.

There are blessings to be found in the sounds of our worship. If you find yourself sneaking into your pew on the third verse of the opening hymn each week, you've already missed out on a lot. Let the Prelude help to tune out the sounds and distractions of the week and let it remind you that you are indeed in a holy place where God comes to meet us. When you find the hymns, sing the thoughts and ideas found there and not just the words. When you sing, have fun! In the space we use, everyone sounds good, including you. At the end of the service, let the chatter and rushing around wait for a few minutes. Your week will be filled with these things. They can wait until the Organ Postlude is finished. The coffee will wait, too. When you get a chance, remember to thank Ann for her music and for what it means for us all.

Luther supposedly said, "He who sings, prays twice." **Amen, Amen!**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I greet you in the name of Jesus, our hope and salvation. This summer, in our diverse settings of ministry and times of rest, we have joined in prayer for those living in the midst of natural disasters, economic uncertainty and famine.

We also have been preparing for our twelfth Churchwide Assembly, August 15-20, 2011. The assembly provides a marvelous opportunity for us to affirm our identity as the ELCA and celebrate God's mission that flows from it.

Whether or not you are able to join us for the assembly in Orlando, I invite you and your congregation to watch the business sessions and worship via live video streaming at www.elca.org/assembly. You will witness a church that shares a living, daring confidence in God's grace and believes the good news that we are freed in Christ to serve our neighbors at home and around the globe.

Throughout the assembly it will be clear that as the ELCA:

- **We are a church whose unity is in Jesus, who gathers us around word and water, bread and wine.** Each day at the assembly, our work will be grounded in our time spent together in worship and Bible study. I encourage you to join us.
- **We are a church called to discern together what the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ means for the world and our common life.** As we consider the social statement on genetics, we stand together again at the intersection of faith and life, discerning how to live responsibly in a complex and rapidly changing world. In a culture plagued by incivility and willful misunderstanding, we believe that respectful dialogue not only is possible, but becomes our way of life.
- **We are a church called to roll up our sleeves and get to work in the world.** Malaria is a leading cause of death in Africa, claiming the life of a child every 45 seconds. We know what it takes to stop this disease -- it's preventable and treatable. A "yes" as a church to the challenge of the ELCA Malaria Campaign means that we will join with our global partners to ensure that a healthier future is possible for millions of people. You will also witness a church that remains engaged in Haiti and Japan, responding to the growing famine in Africa and rebuilding communities devastated by disasters at home. How good it is to recognize the awesome capacity we have when we work together.
- **We are a church committed to vibrant congregations, both newly planted and long established.** A key recommendation of the Living Into the Future Together (LIFT) task force is a priority that every ELCA congregation will be a growing community proclaiming Christ and becoming engaged in the world.

We are a church recognized for our growing global, ecumenical and inter-religious relationships. A greeting at this assembly from Sayyid Syeed will be the first from a representative of the Islamic community. The presence of Bishop George Walker represents our growing relationship with the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church. Martin Junge, general secretary of The Lutheran World Federation, will travel directly from famine-stricken Africa to bring a first-hand report of our shared work there.

Our identity as a church body is inseparable from our call to do God's work in Christ's name for the life of the world. I hope you will join us at the 2011 Churchwide Assembly in August via live streaming at www.elca.org/assembly. Please pray that the Holy Spirit will anoint us with power as we witness to the good news of Jesus Christ.

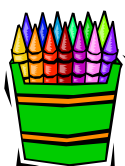

School Kits

We will again be collecting items for school kits this fall. As back to school sales start please keep these items on your list and drop them in the basket at church outside the church office. The kits will be assembled for the fall ingathering. Notice the items have changed so take a look at the list so you include them items currently needed.

Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8"x10½"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2½" eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

PREVENTION AND PROMISE:

LWR KITS KEEP FAMILIES HEALTHY, STUDENTS LEARNING

In February, I traveled to Haiti to visit LWR staff, partners and Haitians one year after the devastating earthquake of January 12, 2010.

Christ Roi de Corail (Christ the King of Corail) is a primary school connected to an Episcopal congregation in the small town of Corail, an isolated area outside of Leogane. The earthquake destroyed both the church and school, and the congregation has been working to rebuild and help the children return to their studies.

One of LWR's partners in Haiti, Lutheran World Federation (LWF), is working with Christ Roi and the community to provide, among other things, access to safe water for the school. On the day I visited, LWF was conducting cholera prevention training with parents and students. Cholera has not yet reached this area, and LWR and LWF are determined to keep it that way.

Following the training, each family received LWR Personal Care Kits and water purification supplies. The Kits, provided by so many of you in the year following the earthquake, arrived at just the right time in this community to help address the secondary crisis of cholera in Haiti.

We've never had cholera before," says Jean Eris Duval, LWF's Haiti program coordinator, "it's not like a Hurricane we're used to every year."

Working through schools is one of the most effective ways to spread the word about cholera prevention, symptoms and treatment. Reaching both parents and students helps ensure that everyone in the family understands how to stay healthy.

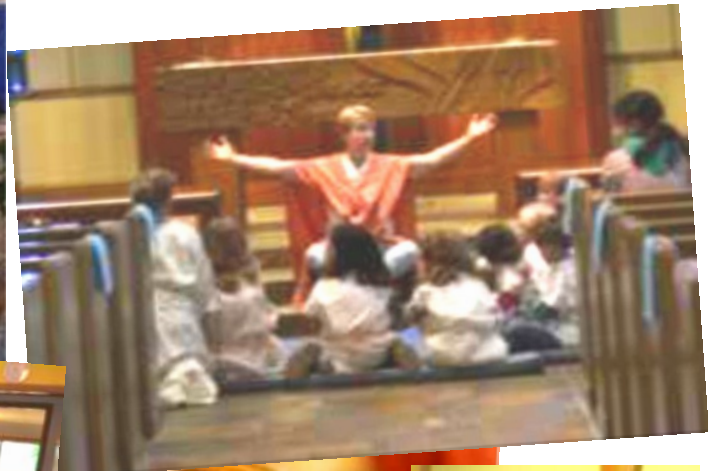
